I suspect you are correct. There is a LOADVC.SYSTEM, which seems to just be a small stub to load VC2, which is the real program. I am not sure that renaming the directory will work though.

> I will give it a whirl - thanks Larry! That is indeed the 800K image that I am using.

I played around with this a bit more. It turns out that the program files and help file need to be in the top level of the volume. The three files that need to be there are VC2, VC2.OVL and HELP.TEXT.FILE (if you want to use the help system.) LOADVC.SYSTEM can be anywhere. The code doesn't care about the name of the volume.

I wrote a little BASIC program to copy the requisite files to the top level of the volume, and to clean them up afterwards. I can post it here if anyone wants it (it uses the ProCMD COPY utility

to copy the files.)
