Since you are not concerned about classic mode then it should be fine. I do not know what you expect to achieve with the upgrade if Tiger is working well for you. Saying that, I upgraded my 933 G4 to Leopard and it is good and stable (10.5.3) - Although I DO miss my Classic applications now. Leopard boots a little faster but many people I have spoken to said Tiger runs smoother and sometimes faster on the G4's. Check some online comparisons. Tiger having all the improvements made from OS 10.1, 10.2, & 10.3 ran nicely for me.

Personally on a 533 MHZ machine I think I would stick with Tiger unless you really want/need the new features in Leopard. Ram? I do not remember what the capacity of the 533 is but the more the better especially if you upgrade.
