It is a design and if you look at the books about drawing cartoons and manga it is clear that you must practice drawing using

manga style characters. People with greater aptitude can do more interesting art as seen in manga like Jin by Murakami Motoka which is a speculative fiction in which Jin the titular protagonist ends up the Edo era as the Bakumatsu is in full swing, he does his best to bring 20th Century medicine to the 1850s but this is mostly realistic art but the women in the story are drawn very much the same due to the mode of makeup and hair styling of the time.
